Requests for Time Extension and Allocation of State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Funds

Issue: SACOG authorization for the California Transportation Commission (CTC) to proceed with requests for time extension and allocation of Regional Improvement Program (RIP) funds in the STIP for the projects specified below.
