Transportation Development Act Claims: City of Yuba City and Yuba Sutter Transit

Issue: The Transportation Development Act provides that cities, counties, and transit operators are eligible to receive certain funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The funds are made available from sales tax receipts. The City of Yuba City has filed a Transportation Development Act claim and Yuba Sutter Transit has submitted an amended claim.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the SACOG Board of Directors approve by resolution the City of Yuba City and Yuba Sutter Transit Transportation Development Act claims:

City of Yuba City in the amount of \$805,339
Yuba Sutter Transit in the amount of \$2,494,400

Committee Action/Discussion:

These funds will be used for various purposes as authorized by law in the amounts to be shown on the resolution. These claims have been reviewed by staff and found to be in compliance with the Transportation Development Act. These claims are also found to be consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, the appropriate Short Range Transit Plans, and appropriate unmet transit needs finding resolution for the City of Yuba City that was adopted by the SACOG Board in July. Current Board policy calls for routine Transportation Development Act allocations to cities and counties to come directly to the Board without review by a committee.

WHEREAS, the City of Yuba City has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act, for FY 2005/06 in the amount of \$805,339 and such funds will be used as follows:

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with State Law, with Guidelines adopted by the Board and with approved apportionments for FY 2005/06; and

WHEREAS, the SACOG Board adopted Resolution No. 26-2005 on July 21, 2005 finding that there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the City of Yuba City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Yuba City has provided the Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority with sufficient funds (\$1,032,985) to provide transit services within the City for FY 2005/06.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the SACOG Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2005/06 in the total amount of \$805,339 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of Yuba City in proportion to funds received from the State.

**APPROVING THE YUBA-SUTTER TRANSIT AUTHORITY'S
REVISED TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT
CLAIM FOR FY 2005/06 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,494,400**

WHEREAS, the Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2005/06 in the amount of \$2,012,400; and

WHEREAS, the Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2005/06 in the amount of \$423,431, unclaimed STA funds from FY 2004/05 in the amount of \$48,129 and unclaimed STA funds from 2000-01 in the amount of \$1,927, and the allocation of \$8,513 of deferred STA revenue held by Yuba Sutter Transit for a total amount of \$482,000, such funds will be used as follows:

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with the Transportation Development Act, with Guidelines adopted by the SACOG Board of Directors and with approved apportionments for FY 2005/06.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 4, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority's proposed expenditures are in conformance with the adopted Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP).
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code as they apply.
3. The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.

4. The amount of this claim does not exceed the amount the Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority is eligible to receive during this fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to this claim because its purpose is to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increases in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area-wide public transportation needs.
6. The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 9924.
7. The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority is not precluded by any contract entered into, on or after June 28, 1979, from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers or persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority has submitted the required certification by the Department of California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1808.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6 or 99314.7.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2005/06 (\$2,012,400) (member contributions in the following amounts; City of Marysville-\$254,052; City of Yuba City-\$1,032,985; County of Yuba-\$564,454; and County of Sutter-\$160,909) and State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2005/06 (\$423,431), FY 2004/05 (\$48,129), and FY 2000/01 (\$1,927), and the allocation of \$8,513 of deferred STA revenue held by Yuba Sutter Transit for a total STA amount of \$482,000, for a total revised claim in the amount of \$2,494,000 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority in proportion to the funds received from the State.
