### Transportation Development Act Claims: City of Davis, City of Isleton, City of Live Oak and Sutter County

**Issue:** The Transportation Development Act provides that cities, counties, and transit operators are eligible to receive certain funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The funds are made available from sales tax receipts. The City of Davis, City of Isleton and City of Live Oak and Sutter County have filed Transportation Development Act claims.

**Recommendation:** Staff recommends that the SACOG Board of Directors approve by resolution the City of Davis, City of Isleton, City of Live Oak and Sutter County Transportation Development Act claims:

City of Davis in the amount of \$3,150,267	Resolution No. 18 – 2006
City of Isleton in the amount of \$33,758	Resolution No. 19 – 2006
City of Live Oak in the amount of \$231,053	Resolution No. 20 – 2006
Sutter County in the amount of \$636,226	Resolution No. 21 – 2006

#### Committee Action/Discussion:

These funds will be used for various purposes as authorized by law in the amounts to be shown on the resolutions. These claims have been reviewed by staff and found to be in compliance with the Transportation Development Act. These claims are also found to be consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, the appropriate Short Range Transit Plans, and appropriate unmet transit needs finding resolution for the City of Davis, City of Isleton, City of Live Oak, and Sutter County that were adopted by the SACOG Board in July 2005. Current Board policy calls for routine Transportation Development Act allocations to cities and counties to come directly to the Board without review by a committee.

**APPROVING THE CITY OF DAVIS' TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT  
CLAIM FOR FY 2005/2006 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,150,267**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Davis has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for FY 2005/2006 Local Transportation Funds in the amount of \$2,818,032; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Davis has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2002/03 in the amount of \$36,438, FY 2004/05 in the amount of \$30,387 and FY 2005/06 in the amount of \$265,410 for a total STA amount of \$332,235, and such funds will be used as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the Board adopted Resolution No. 27-2005 on June 21, 2005 finding that there are no unmet transit needs in the City of Davis that are reasonable to meet, and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Davis has allocated \$214,896 of unexpended prior year LTF funds claimed for transit purposes for support of the Davis Community Transit program in FY 2005/06.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The City of Davis' proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the City of Davis to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code.

3. The City of Davis is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
4. The sum of the City of Davis' allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority areawide public transportation needs.
6. The City of Davis has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Davis is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979, from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Yolo County Transportation District, has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The City of Davis is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2005/06 in the amount of \$2,818,032 and for State Transit Assistance funds for FY 2002/03 in the amount of \$36,438, FY 2004/05 in the amount of \$30,387 and FY 2005/06 in the amount of \$265,410 for a total STA amount of \$332,236, for a total claim in the amount of \$3,150,267 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of Davis in proportion to funds received from the State.

4. The sum of the City of Live Oak's allocations from the State Transit Assistance Fund and from the Local Transportation Fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area-wide public transportation needs.
