Transportation Development Act Claims: City of Citrus Heights, City of Elk Grove, City of Isleton, City of Woodland, City of Yuba City and Yolo County

Issue: The Transportation Development Act provides that cities, counties, and transit operators are eligible to receive certain funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The funds are made available from sales tax receipts. The Cities of Elk Grove, Citrus Heights, Isleton, Woodland, Yuba City and Yolo County have filed Transportation Development Act claims.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve by resolution the Transportation Development Act claims for the Cities of Citrus Heights, Elk Grove, Isleton, Woodland, Yuba City and Yolo County:

These claims are also found to be consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, the appropriate Short Range Transit Plans, and appropriate unmet transit needs finding resolution for the each of the jurisdictions for the year of the claim that were adopted by the SACOG Board in July 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006. Current Board policy calls for routine Transportation Development Act allocations to cities and counties to come directly to the Board without review by a committee.

APPROVING THE CITY OF CITRUS HEIGHTS TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT CLAIM FOR FY 2006/07 FOR \$4,664,134, FY 2005/06 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$79,605, AND FY 2004/05 FOR 26,289 FOR A TOTAL CLAIM OF \$4,770,028

WHEREAS, the City of Citrus Heights has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2006/07 in the amount of \$3,910,025; and

WHEREAS, the City of Citrus Heights has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2006/07 \$754,109, 2005/06 for \$79,605, and FY2004/05 for \$26,289, for a total STA amount of \$860,003, and such funds will be used as follows:

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with the Transportation Development Act, with Guidelines adopted by the SACOG Board of Directors and with approved apportionments for FY 2006/07; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that these funds are being used to respond to a transportation need that would not otherwise be met within the community, are coordinated with the area's transit operators and continues and improves the transportation services traditionally provided to the City of Citrus Heights by the Sacramento Regional Transit District; and

WHEREAS, the Board adopted Resolution No. 23-2006 on July, 20, 2006 finding that there are unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the City of Citrus Heights;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The City of Citrus Heights proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the City of Citrus Heights to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code.
3. The City of Citrus Heights is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
4. The sum of the City of Citrus Heights allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs.
6. The City of Citrus Heights has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Citrus Heights is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Sacramento Regional Transit District, has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The City of Citrus Heights is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2006/07 (\$3,910,025), and State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2006/07 (\$754,109), FY 2005/06 (\$79,605), and FY 2004/05 (\$26,289), for a total State Transit amount of \$860,003 and a total claim amount of \$4,769,488, and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of Citrus Heights in proportion to funds received from the State.

WHEREAS, the Board adopted Resolution No. 25-2005 on July 21, 2005, finding that there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the City of Elk Grove.

6. The City of Woodland has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Woodland is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Yolo County Transportation District, has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The City of Woodland is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.
