Approve Transportation Development Act Claim for FY 2008-09 for the City of Davis

Issue: The Transportation Development Act provides that cities, counties, and transit operators are eligible to receive certain funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The funds are made available from sales tax receipts. The City of Davis has filed its FY 2008-09 Transportation Development Act claim.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve by resolution the FY 2008-09 Transportation Development Act claim for the City of Davis.

1. City of Davis in the amount of \$3,309,532 Resolution No. 30 – 2009

Committee Action/Discussion: These funds will be used for various purposes as authorized by law in the amounts to be shown on the resolution. The claim has been reviewed by staff and found to be in compliance with the Transportation Development Act. The claim is also consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and the appropriate Unitrans and Yolo County Transportation District Short Range Transit Plans. Current Board policy calls for routine Transportation Development Act allocations to cities and counties to come directly to the Board without review by a committee.

RESOLUTION NO. 30 – 2009

**APPROVING THE CITY OF DAVIS’S TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT
CLAIM FOR FY 2008-09 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,309,532**

WHEREAS, the City of Davis has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for FY 2008-09 Local Transportation Funds in the amount of \$2,612,007; and

WHEREAS, the City of Davis previously claimed under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act for FY 2007-08 Local Transportation Funds in the amount of \$341,392 and will use the funds for operating assistance for Unitrans; and

WHEREAS, the City of Davis has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2008-09 in the amount of \$192,816; and

WHEREAS, the City of Davis has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2007-2008 in the amount of \$163,317, and such funds will be used as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board adopted Resolution No. 8-2008 on March 20, 2008, finding that there are no unmet transit needs in the City of Davis that are reasonable to meet; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The City of Davis's proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the City of Davis to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code
4. The sum of the City of Davis's allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority areawide public transportation needs.
6. The City of Davis has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Davis is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979, from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Yolo County Transportation District, has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The City of Davis is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2008-09 in the amount of \$2,612,007, for Local Transportation Funds previously claimed in FY 2007-2008 for \$341,392, for State Transit Assistance funds for FY 2007-08 in the amount of \$163,317 and for State Transit Assistance funds for FY 2008-09 in the amount of \$192,816 for a total claim in the amount of \$3,309,532 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of Davis in proportion to funds received from the State.
