Transportation Development Act Claim for the Cities of West Sacramento and Winters

Issue: The Transportation Development Act provides that cities, counties, and transit operators are eligible to receive certain funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The funds are made available from sales tax receipts. The City of West Sacramento has filed their FY 2009-2010 Transportation Development Act Claim and the City of Winters has filed their FY 2008-2009 Transportation Development Act Claim.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve by resolution the FY 2008-09 and FY 2009-10 Transportation Development Act claims for the cities of West Sacramento and Winters.

1. City of Winters in the amount of \$732,957 Resolution No. 33–2009
2. City of West Sacramento in the amount of \$2,231,111 Resolution No. 34–2009

Committee Action/Discussion: These funds will be used for various purposes as authorized by law in the amounts to be shown on the resolution. The claims have been reviewed by staff and found to be in compliance with the Transportation Development Act. The claims are also consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and the appropriate Yolo County Transportation District Short Range Transit Plan. Current Board policy calls for routine Transportation Development Act allocations to cities and counties to come directly to the Board without review by a committee.

WHEREAS, the City of Winters has submitted a request for Local Transportation Funds (LTF) for FY 2008-2009 in the amount of \$276,960; and

WHEREAS, the City of Winters has submitted a request to adjust previously claimed and held Local Transportation Funds (LTF) for FY 2005-2006 in the amount of \$39,833; and

WHEREAS, the City of Winters previously claimed and held Local Transportation Funds (LTF) in the amount of \$348,862; and

WHEREAS, the City of Winters has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2006-2007 in the amount of \$37,794; and

WHEREAS, the City of Winters has submitted a request for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2007-2008 in the amount of \$29,508 and these funds will be used as follows:

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with the Transportation Development Act, with Guidelines adopted by the Board and with approved apportionments for FY 2008-2009, and

WHEREAS, the Board adopted Resolution No. 22 – 2008 on March 20, 2008, finding that there are no unmet transit needs in the City of Winters that are reasonable to meet, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The City of Winters proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the City of Winters to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code
4. The sum of the City of Winters allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority areawide public transportation needs.
6. The City of Winters has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Winters is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979, from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Yolo County Transportation District, has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The Yolo County Transportation District is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2008-2009 in the amount of \$276,960, and previously approved Local Transportation Funds adjusted from transit capital to streets and roads from FY 2005-2006 in the amount of \$39,833, and for \$348,862 of prior year Local Transportation Fund previously claimed but unused and for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2006-2007 in the amount of \$37,794 and for State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2007-2008 in the amount of \$29,508 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of Winters in proportion to funds received from the State

APPROVING THE CITY OF WEST SACRAMENTO’S TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT CLAIM FOR FY 2009-2010 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,231,111

WHEREAS, the City of West Sacramento has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act, for FY 2009-2010 Local Transportation Funds in the amount of \$1,635,330; and

WHEREAS, the City of West Sacramento has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act, for FY 2008-2009 Local Transportation Funds in the amount of \$554,399; and

WHEREAS, the City of West Sacramento has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act, for FY 2006-2007 State Transit Assistance Funds in the amount of \$12,749; and

WHEREAS, the City of West Sacramento has submitted a claim under the provisions of the Transportation Development Act, for FY 2007-2008 State Transit Assistance Funds in the amount of \$28,633 and such funds will be used as follows:

WHEREAS, the City of West Sacramento will carry over the remaining FY 2009-2010 LTF balance amount of \$353,521 into FY 2010-2011 to continue operations of YCTD routes servicing West Sacramento; and

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with State Law, with Guidelines adopted by the Board and with approved apportionments for FY 2009-2010; and

WHEREAS, the Board Resolution No. 22 - 2009 on April 16, 2009, finding that there are unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the City of West Sacramento; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 4, Section 6754:

1. The City of West Sacramento's 2008-2009 expenditures are in conformance with the adopted Metropolitan Transportation Plan;
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the City of West Sacramento to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code as they apply;
3. The City of West Sacramento is making full use of federal funds available under the Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended;
4. The amount of this claim does not exceed the amount the City of West Sacramento is eligible to receive during this fiscal year;
5. Priority consideration has been given to this claim because its purpose is to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increases in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs;
6. The city of West Sacramento has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of West Sacramento is not precluded by any contract entered into or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Yolo County Transportation District, has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The Yolo County Transportation District is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6 or 99314.7.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2009-2010 in the total amount of \$1,635,330 and for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2008-2009 in the total amount of \$554,399 and for FY 2006-2007 State Transit Assistance funds in the amount of \$12,749 and for FY 2007-2008 State Transit Assistance funds in the amount of \$28,633 for a total claim amount of \$2,231,111 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of West Sacramento in proportion to funds received from the State.
