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ABOUT THIS DOCUMENT

Federal regulations, under the *Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users* (SAFETEA-LU), require the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) to publish annual listings of projects using federal funds obligated during the prior federal fiscal year (FFY). The Annual Listing provides a record of project delivery for the year. The Annual Listing is also intended to increase the awareness of government spending on transportation projects to the public. Obligation of federal funds means that a project has received a federal commitment for reimbursement, and does not necessarily mean that the project was initiated or completed in that year or that the obligation amount indicates the total cost of that project.

ABOUT THE SACRAMENTO AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

The Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) is an association of Sacramento Valley governments formed from the six regional counties—El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba—and 22 member cities. SACOG's work is guided by a 31-member policy board.

Over the years, state and federal laws have given SACOG an increasingly important role in financing transportation improvements within the six county Sacramento Region. At the federal level, the 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act and its successor, the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century, empowered metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) like SACOG to determine the mix of transportation projects best suited to meet their region's needs. Congress reaffirmed the MPOs' role in transportation financing in 2005 with the passage of the SAFETEA-LU.

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN FOR 2035

As the agency responsible for transportation planning in the six-county Sacramento Region, SACOG is responsible for adopting the Sacramento Region's regional transportation plan. The new plan, known as Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for 2035, was adopted by SACOG in March 2008. The MTP was developed after an extensive planning process over some 24 months with extensive public involvement.

The MTP specifies a detailed set of investments and strategies throughout the region from 2008 through 2035 to maintain, manage and improve the surface transportation network. Updated every four years to reflect new planning priorities and changing projections of growth and travel demand, the MTP must be based on a realistic forecast of future revenues. Taken as a whole, the projects included must help improve regional air quality. For context, the region relies on various fund sources—among them federal funds—to achieve the set of investments in the plan.

As a reminder, this obligation report is limited to federal funds and does not include all revenues expended on transportation in a given year.

Only projects listed in the MTP's financially constrained list may be placed in the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) for federal funding.

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The federally required Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program, or MTIP, is a comprehensive listing of all Sacramento Region transportation projects that are regionally significant, receive federal funds, or are subject to a federally-required action, such as a review for impacts on air quality. In order for a project to receive a federal obligation, the project's funds must be listed in the MTIP. The MTIP sets forth SACOG's investment priorities for transit and transit-related improvements, highways and roadways, bicycle and pedestrian, and other surface transportation improvements in the six county Sacramento Region. SACOG prepares and adopts the MTIP every two years. The MTIP must cover at least four years and contain a priority list of projects grouped by year. Further, the MTIP must be financially constrained by year (meaning that the amount of dollars programmed must not exceed the amount of dollars estimated to be available). Federal regulations also require an opportunity for public comment prior to MTIP approval.

ANNUAL OBLIGATED PROJECT LISTING SUMMARY

This annual listing shows that approximately \$196 million of federal funds were obligated in FFY 2006 in the SACOG region for highway, local road, transit, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, transportation enhancement, and air quality projects. The following chart illustrates the breakdown of obligations by obligating agency:

ANNUAL OBLIGATED PROJECTS LISTING EXPLANATION

There are three tables included in the listing:

- Table 1: Local Projects obligated, sorted by county and project title. This list includes projects using FHWA fund sources such as Surface Transportation Program (STP), Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ), Transportation Enhancements (TE), and Federal High-Priority Earmarks (HI-PRIO).
- Table 2: Transit projects, sorted by lead agency and project. This list includes all funds transferred directly to FTA.
- Table 3: State-Managed Highway projects, sorted by county and project title. This list includes all funds obligated by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for work on the state highway system, and includes fund sources such as Emergency Relief (ER), Interstate Maintenance (IM), Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and National Highway System (NHS) funds.

For Tables 1 and 2, the columns in the listing include:

- County, indicates the county in which the project is located.
- Agency sponsor for the project.
- Project Title and Project Description.
- Program Code indicates the obligated fund source.
- Federal Project ID, indicates the federal project identification code (for FTA transfers, this is the grant number).
- MTIP ID, the identification code for the project in SACOG's MTIP. Please note that if there are multiple obligations for each MTIP ID, the remaining obligation amount will also be displayed multiple times.
- The EA (Expenditure Authorization) is the number assigned to the project, assigned by Caltrans.
- Obligation Amount indicates the amount authorized. Negative numbers indicate a deobligation, where the federal funding commitment is no longer given for the project.
- Bike/Ped, references a Bicycle/Pedestrian project.

Table 3 also includes AC (Advance Construction) Requested. Advance construction is where the agency has already spent local dollars to "advance construct" the project. Under the Advance Construction process, local agencies may proceed with implementing the project using Local Funded Advance Construction (AC) after the AC has been programmed in the MTIP and the procedures in the Local Assistance Preventative Maintenance Program Guidelines have been followed. However, reimbursement cannot be promised until the AC is converted to federal

funds. See Chapter 2 of the Caltrans Local Assistance Program Guidelines for more information on AC.

Caltrans may have additional information regarding the obligations they manage. Some information was left blank, as it was not available.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

1. SACOG must file this annual listing no later than 90 calendar days, following the end of the program year.
 - ▶ **ACTION:** SACOG listed the draft version (on its website) before September 1, 2008, and the final version was approved in September 2008.
2. SACOG shall develop this document cooperatively with the State and Public Transportation Operators.
 - ▶ **ACTION:** SACOG presented the draft document to its Regional Planning Partnership (RPP) in August 2008. This committee assists in regional federal planning and oversight activities.
3. SACOG shall include a listing of the investments (obligations) in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities
 - ▶ **ACTION:** Pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities are so noted on Tables 1 & 3.
4. This listing shall be prepared in accordance with Section 450.314(a) and shall include all federally funding projects authorized or revised to increase obligations in the preceding program year, and shall at minimum include:
 - A. MTIP information number (SACOG ID) under Section 450.324(e) (1) and (4).
 - B. Amount of federal funds requested in the MTIP.
 - C. Federal funding that was obligated during the preceding year.
 - D. Federal Funding remaining and available for subsequent years.
 - E. The listing shall be published or made available in accordance with SACOG's public participation for the MTIP.
 - ▶ **ACTION:** Tables 1, 2, and 3 reflect the requirements above except for "Federal Funding remaining and available for subsequent years" by project. Instead, the MTIP shows this information by project and it is available on SACOG's website.

- ▶ **ACTION:** SACOG's Public Participation Plan, under SAFETEA-LU states that the MPO shall develop and use a documented participation plan that defines a process for providing all interested parties with reasonable opportunities to be involved in the metropolitan planning process. As such SACOG performed the following:
 - Posted a draft report on its website prior to September 1, 2008.
 - Presented the draft report to the RPP in August 2008, for its input.
 - Posted the final version to its website prior to October 2008.
 - Sent all appropriate federal and state agencies the final version of the report.

WHAT WE DO

The Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) is an association of Sacramento Valley governments formed from the six regional counties—El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba—and 22 member cities. SACOG's directors are chosen from the elected boards of its member governments. SACOG's primary charge is to provide regional transportation planning and funding, as well as a forum for the study and resolution of regional issues. In this role, SACOG prepares the region's long-range transportation plan; approves distribution of affordable housing around the region; keeps a region-wide database for its own and local agency use; helps counties and cities use federal transportation funds in a timely way; assists in planning for transit, bicycle networks, clean air and airport land uses; and has completed the Blueprint Project which links transportation and land development more closely.

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
