Contracts Related to the Project Level Analysis for the Environmental Streamlining Work under the HUD Sustainable Communities Regional Planning Grant

Issue: SACOG is working with three of our case study sites under the Sustainable Communities Regional Planning Grant to develop Sustainable Community Environmental Assessments (SCEA) to demonstrate the environmental streamlining benefits of SB 375. The SCEA work may involve contract consultants for unique environmental analysis beyond the expertise of SACOG staff, specifically in air quality or biological assessments. This work is funded by the planning grant and budgeted in our approved Overall Work Program.

Recommendation: That the SACOG Board of Directors authorize the Chief Executive Officer to enter into contracts following a competitive bid process after consulting with the Board Chair, the Board Vice-Chair, the Committee Chair, and the Committee Vice-Chair. While the Land Use & Air Quality Committee members expressed support on this item, there was not a quorum to make a recommendation to the Board.

Committee Action/Discussion: In June 2011, the Strategic Planning Committee selected five case study areas where SACOG would use the resources provided through the HUD Sustainable Community Regional Planning Grant to develop action plans for MTP/SCS Implementation. A centerpiece of the implementation is the development of the SCEA, one of the main California Environmental Quality Act streamlining tools available under SB 375, for the pertinent case study areas. The amount of each contract for the unique environmental analysis would be under \$30,000. Staff are still determining the total budget available for this task.

Staff has completed the first draft SCEA for a project area in the city of West Sacramento, which is currently under review by city staff. Two additional documents are being written with the county of Sacramento and the city of Rancho Cordova. These two documents may require specific project level analysis. Due to the schedule for these documents, staff may need to have analysis underway before the Board could approve a contract at the next meeting on December 6. Currently, SACOG has not received a request for assistance on environmental analysis for the other two case study sites.

A schedule for the HUD Sustainable Communities Regional Planning Grant project tasks is attached. Staff plans to have a discussion of the housing components of the project with the committee in late November.
