**1. Introductions and Info Sharing**

- a. **State Active Transportation Program Technical Assistance.** SACOG will review draft State ATP applications; email a draft copy to Victoria Cacciatore by or before July 13. Comments will be sent back within a week or less. SACOG is also promoting how project sponsors can use the Project Performance Assessment Tool to provide supportive data in applications. <https://www.sacog.org/active-transportation-program>
- b. **Approved Regional Funding Round Programming Targets.** The SACOG Board of Directors approved the Regional Funding Round programming targets in April.

**2. Action Summary from March 28, 2018 Meeting.** Ryan Dodge motioned to approve the action summary. Mary Poole seconded the motion. The Partnership voted to approve the action summary and the motion carried.

**3. 2018/2019 RPP Meeting Schedule.** Victoria Cacciatore reviewed the proposed bi-monthly meeting calendar built around significant project milestones, such as conformity determination needs in August. Mary Poole motioned to approve the action summary. Kevin Bewsey seconded the motion. The Partnership voted to approve the meeting schedule and the motion carried.

**4. Update on Project of Air Quality Concern Determinations.** Renee Devere-Oki shared that four projects were reviewed for air quality concern since the last update in February, though none were found to meet the criteria. No projects were reviewed in eastern Solano County during the same time period.

**5. Update on the 2020 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy.**

Clint Holtzen updated the Partnership on the status of the MTP/SCS update. SACOG is roughly one quarter through the calendar and has met with all jurisdictions. The draft land use allocation calls for more infill development than the last plan because of more stringent greenhouse gas emissions targets (19%). The target adoption date for the 2020 MTP/SCS is spring 2020, approximately one year after the board is scheduled to act on the land use allocation and transportation project list.

**6. SACOG Funding Programs.** Sabrina Bradbury shared information about the three Transportation Demand Management programs. The Traditional and Innovations programs have grant applications due July 27, while the Mini-grants are accepted on a rolling basis. SACOG consolidated evaluation criteria across all three programs and weighted criteria differently according to the emphasis of each program.

Raef Porter provided an overview of the new Green Region program, which aims to help the Sacramento Region emit fewer transportation-related emissions. The program will look at electric and zero-emissions vehicles across five different groups: personal vehicles, shared rides and vehicles, public and private microtransit and shuttles, medium and heavy duty fleets, and disadvantaged communities. Projects applying to Green Region should be CMAQ-eligible. Green Regional applications are due August 24.

**7. Civic Lab Year 2: Commercial Corridors.** Raef Porter updated the Partnership about the newly board-approved topic for Civic Lab. As a region, we need commercial corridors to be vibrant, but the topic is best implemented at the local level. The call for proposals will be in August, and SACOG is encouraging potential teams to include business owners. If you have suggestions of national experts who should present to Civic Lab teams (e.g. market analysis, architecture firms), send them to Raef Porter.
