**SACOG Board of Directors**

November 29, 2012

**Approve the Transportation Development Act Claims for the City of Folsom, City of West Sacramento, City of Wheatland, City of Yuba City, and County of Yuba.**

**Issue:** The Transportation Development Act (TDA) authorizes eligible cities, counties, and transit operators to receive TDA funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The TDA funds are made available from sales tax receipts.

**Recommendation:** Staff recommends that the Board approve this summary resolution of the TDA claims listed below.

**WHEREAS**, the Board Resolution No. 28-2012 on June 7, 2012 found that there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the City of Folsom.

3. The City of Folsom is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
4. The sum of the City of Folsom's allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs.
6. The City of Folsom has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Folsom is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The City of Folsom has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The City of Folsom is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.
