Approve the Transportation Development Act Claims for the City of Davis, City of Sacramento, and Yuba County

Issue: The Transportation Development Act provides that cities, counties, and transit operators are eligible to receive certain funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The funds are made available from sales tax receipts. The city of Davis, city of Sacramento, and Yuba County have filed their claims for FY 2010-2011 and FY 2011-2012.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve by resolution the amended FY 2010-2011 Transportation Development Act claim for the city of Davis, the FY 2011-12 claim for the city of Davis, the FY 2011-2012 claim for the city of Sacramento, and the FY 2011-2012 claim for the county of Yuba.

Committee Action/Discussion: Current Board policy calls for routine Transportation Development Act allocations to cities, counties, and transit operators to come directly to the Board without review by a committee. These funds will be used for various purposes as authorized by law in the amounts to be shown on the resolution. The claim has been reviewed by staff and found to be in compliance with the Transportation Development Act. The claims are also consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and the Short-Range Transit Plans for the Yolo County Transportation District, Unitrans, and the Yuba-Sutter Transit.

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with State Law, with Guidelines adopted by the Board and with approved apportionments for FY 2009-10 and FY 2010-11; and

WHEREAS, the Board Resolution No. 27-2010 on April 15, 2010, finding that there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the city of Davis; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The city of Davis proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the city of Davis to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code.
3. The city of Davis is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
4. The sum of the city of Davis allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs.
6. The city of Davis has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The city of Davis is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The contractor, Veolia Inc., has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The city of Davis is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2010-2011 with the condition that the city of Davis continue to work with SACOG to plan and procure and additional vehicle for Davis Community Transit to provide a spare capacity during peak service hours using any available Transportation Development Act Funds or other sources.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2010-11 in the amount of \$2,118,266 and State Transit Assistance Funds for FY 2009-10 in the amount of \$493,181, for a total claim amount of \$2,611,447 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the city of Davis in proportion to funds received from the State.
