Approve the Transportation Development Act Claims for the City of Davis

Issue: The Transportation Development Act (TDA) authorizes eligible cities, counties, and transit operators to receive TDA funds for transportation purposes and street and road projects. The TDA funds are made available from sales tax receipts.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board approve the TDA claims listed below.

1. City of Davis FY 2012-13 LTF claim in the amount of \$3,094,769 Resolution No. 29 – 2014
2. City of Davis FY 2012-13 STA claim in the amount of \$520,792 Resolution No. 29 – 2014

Committee Action/Discussion: Current Board policy calls for routine TDA allocations to cities, counties, and transit operators to come directly to the Board without review by a committee. These funds will be used as authorized by law for various purposes and in the amounts shown on the attached resolutions. The claims have been reviewed by staff and found to be in compliance with the TDA and are consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and the Short Range Transit Plans.

WHEREAS, such claim is consistent with State Law, with Guidelines adopted by the Board and with approved apportionments for FY 2012-13; and

WHEREAS, the Board Resolution No. 6-2014 on February 20, 2014, found that there are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet in the City of Davis.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby makes the following findings in accordance with Subchapter 2.5, Article 5, Section 6754 of the Transportation Development Act:

1. The City of Davis’s proposed expenditures are in conformity with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.
2. The level of passenger fares and charges is sufficient to enable the City of Davis to meet the fare revenue requirements of the Public Utilities Code.

3. The City of Davis is making full use of federal funds available under the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended.
4. The sum of the City of Davis’s allocations from the state transit assistance fund and from the local transportation fund does not exceed the amount the claimant is eligible to receive during the fiscal year.
5. Priority consideration has been given to claims to offset reductions in federal operating assistance and the unanticipated increase in the cost of fuel, to enhance existing public transportation services, and to meet high priority area wide public transportation needs.
6. The City of Davis has made a reasonable effort to implement the productivity improvements recommended pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 99244.
7. The City of Davis is not precluded by any contract entered into on or after June 28, 1979 from employing part-time drivers or from contracting with common carriers of persons operating under a franchise or license.
8. The City of Davis has submitted the certification required by the Department of the California Highway Patrol verifying that the operator is in compliance with Section 1801.1 of the Vehicle Code.
9. The City of Davis is in compliance with the eligibility requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 99314.6.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves the request for Local Transportation Funds for FY 2012-13 in the amount of \$3,094,769 and State Transit Assistance Funds for FY2012-13 in the amount of \$520,792 for a total claim amount of \$3,615,561 and authorizes the forwarding of funds to the City of Davis in proportion to funds received from the State.
