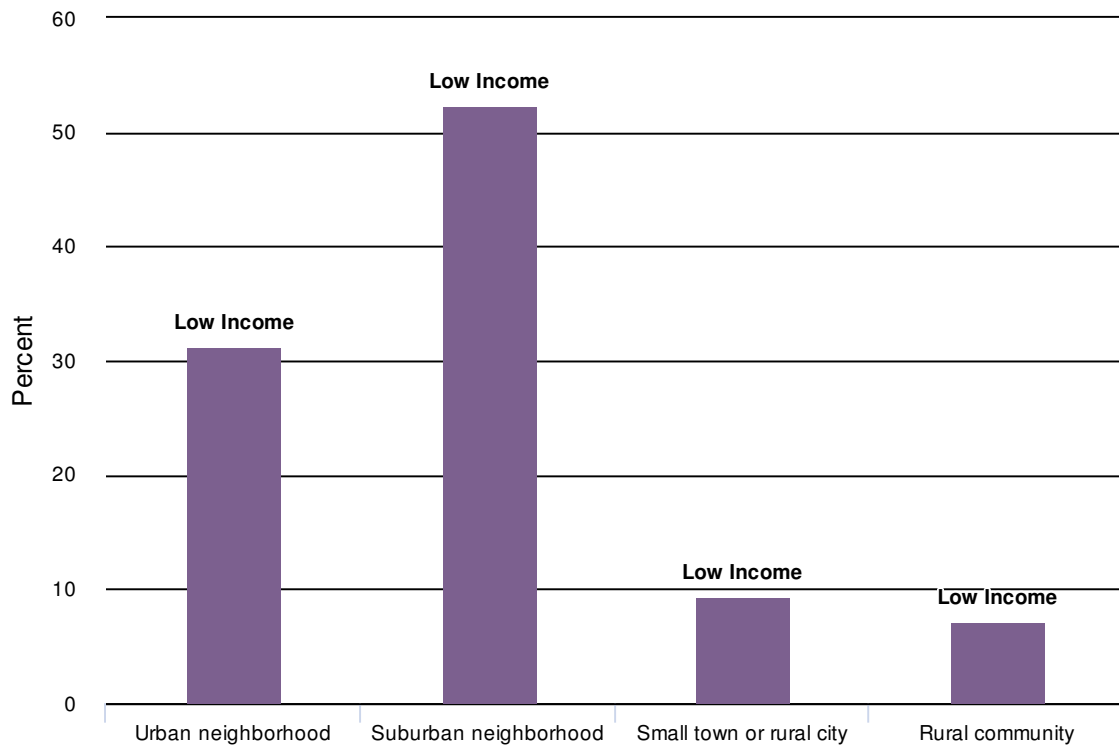

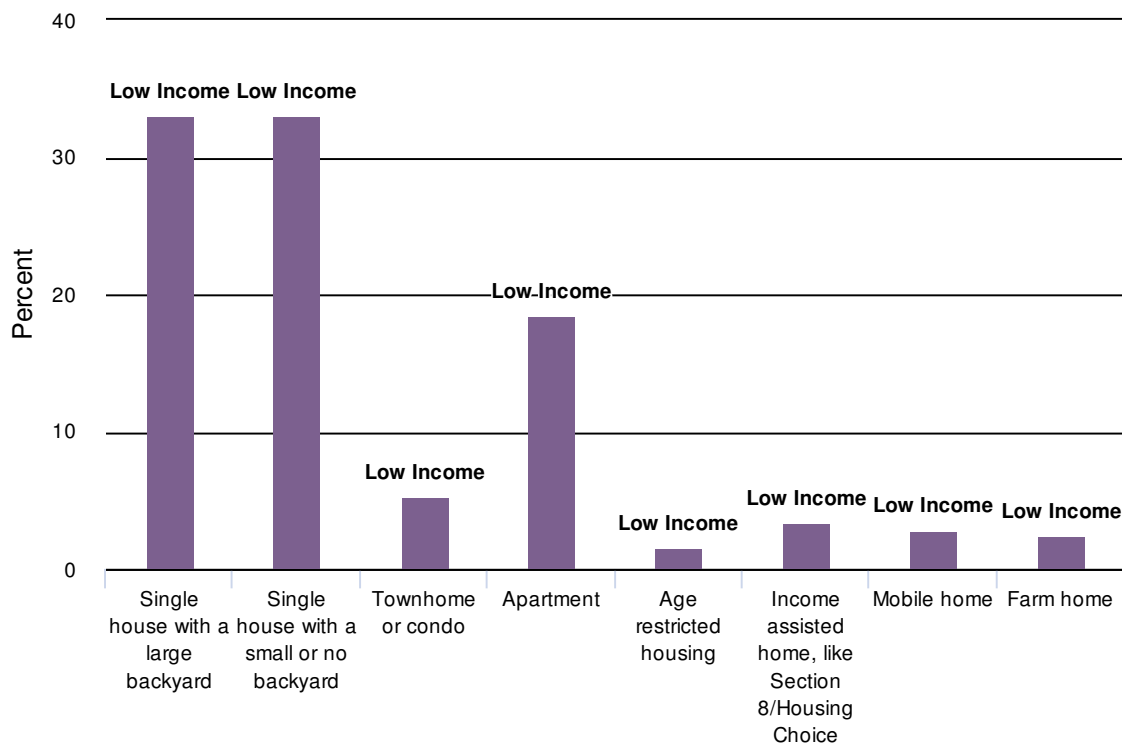

1. How would you describe the community you live in?



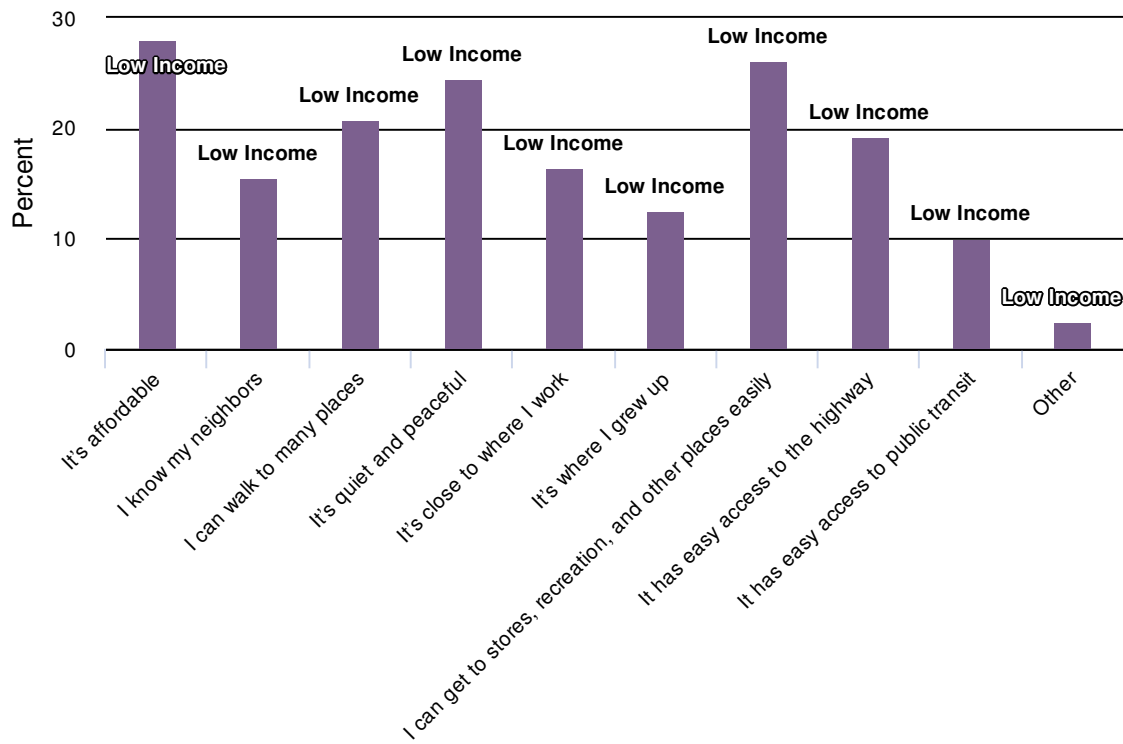

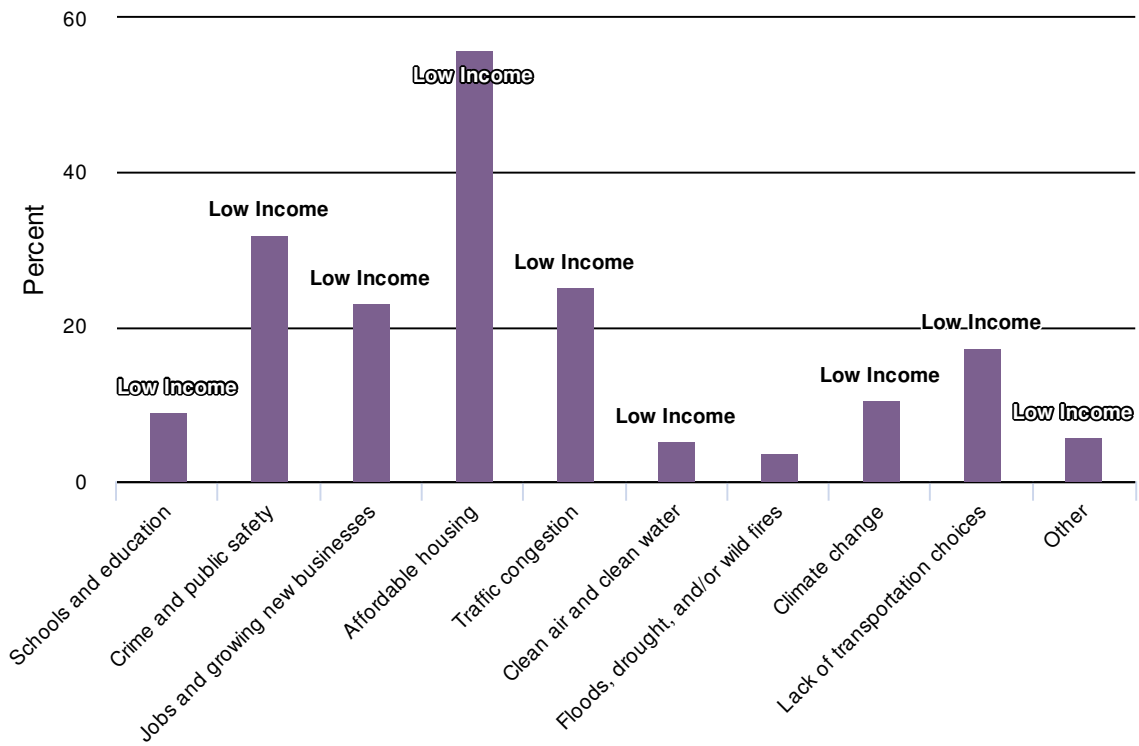

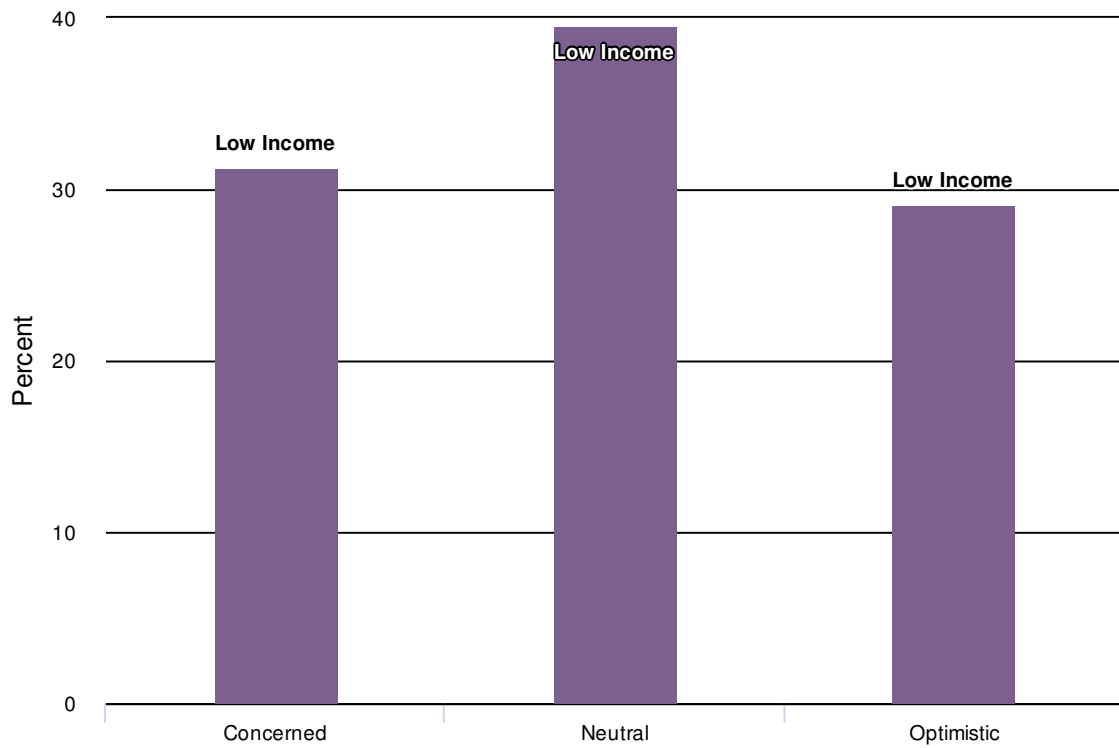

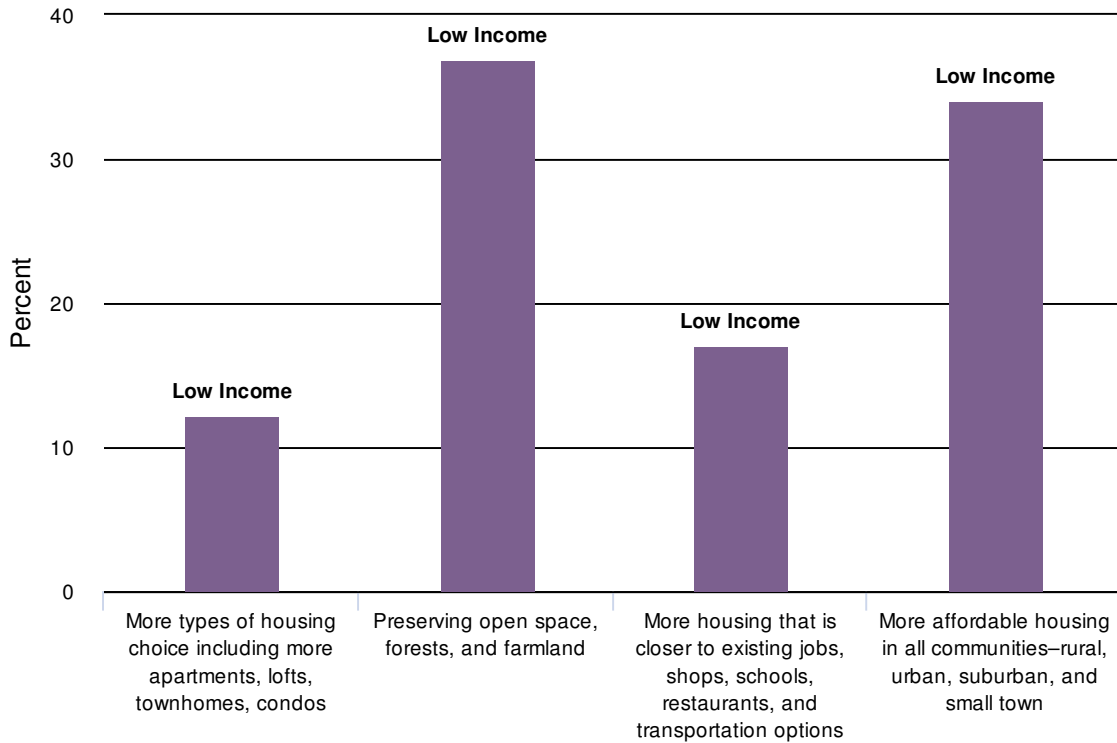

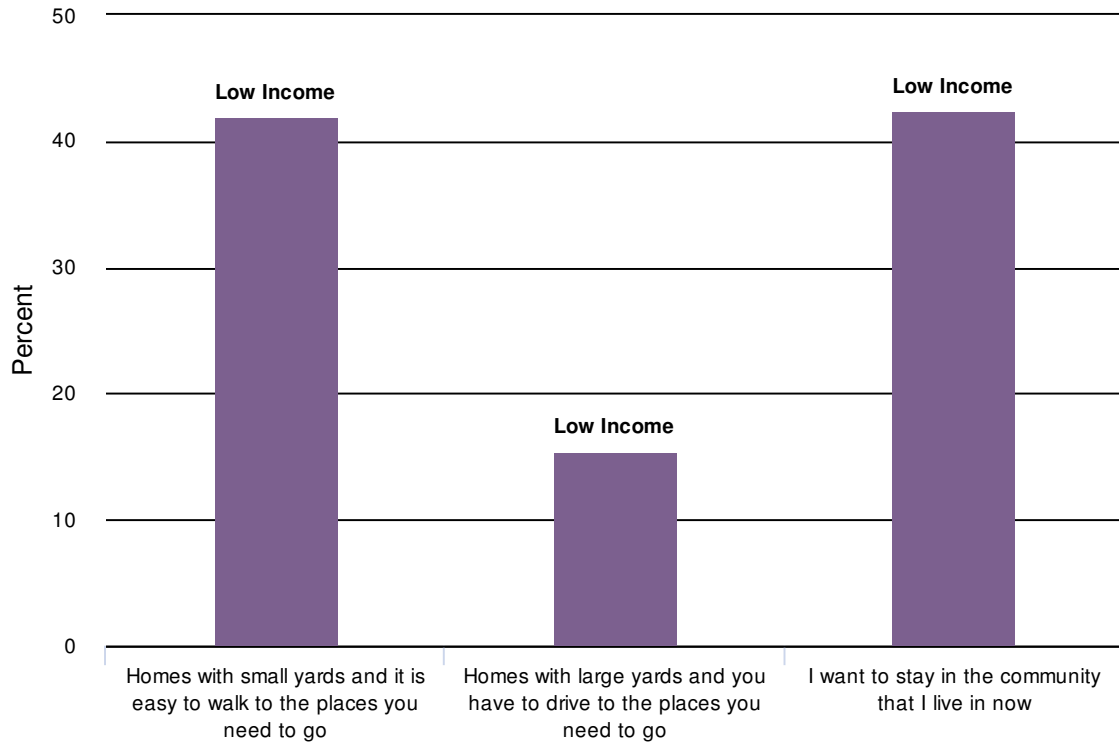

7. As the region grows, which of the following is the most important to you?



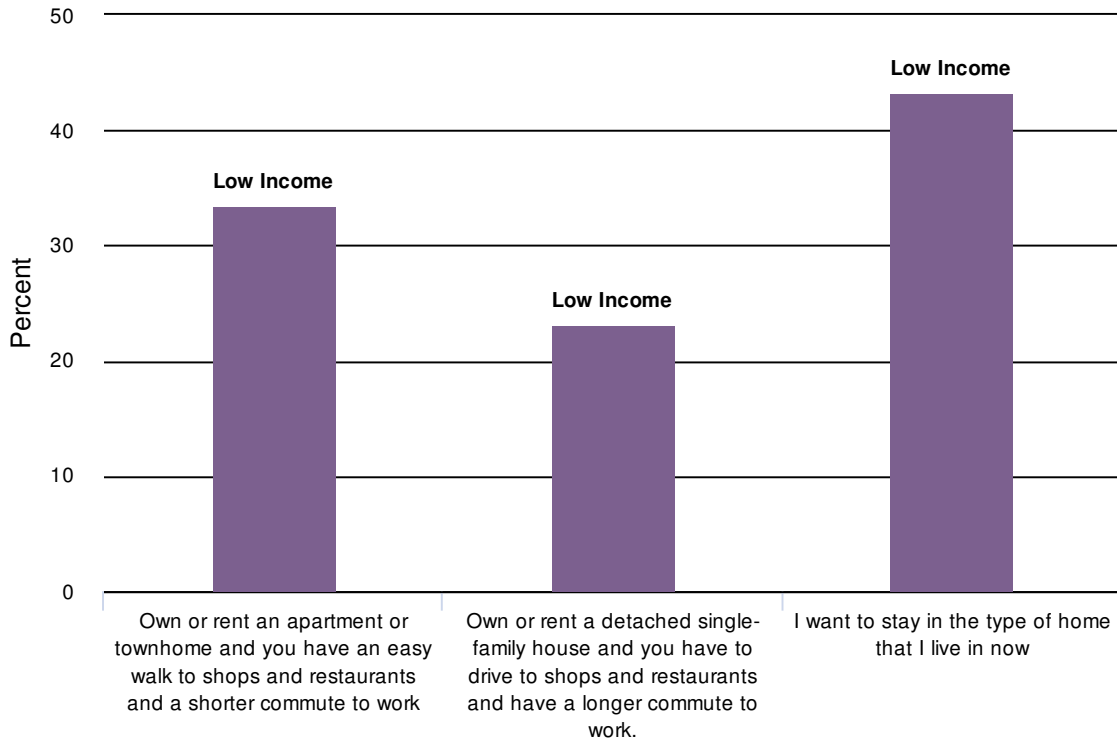

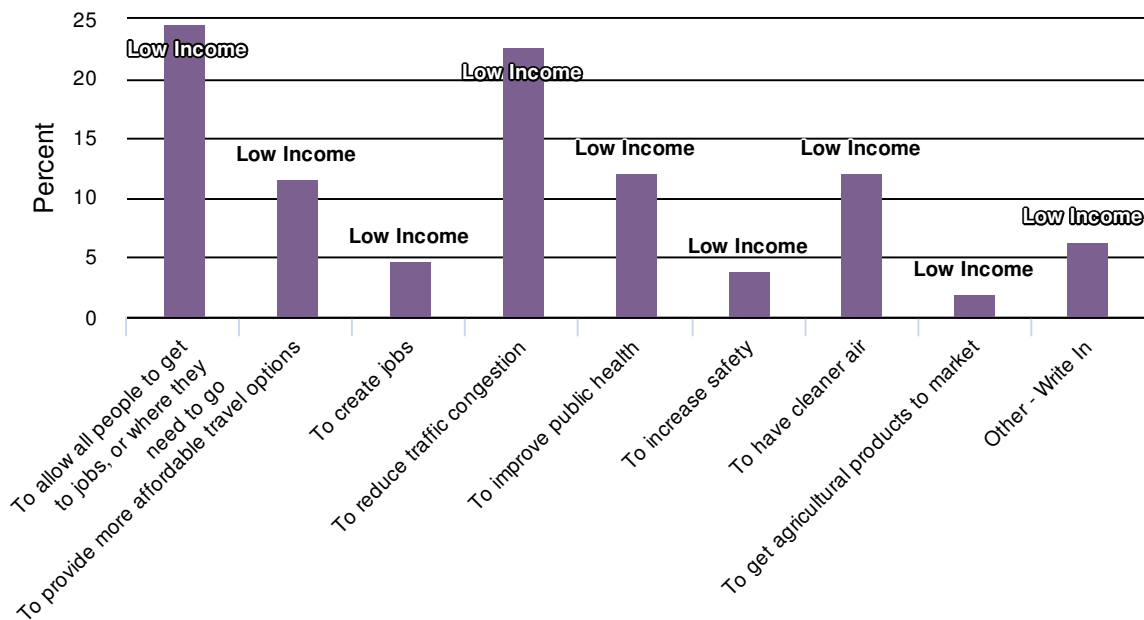
